CONDOLENCE MOTION - VALE DR JOHN KAYE GREENS MLC

It is with enormous sadness that I move this condolence motion for Dr John Kaye Greens MLC who died on May 2 aged 60 from cancer.

John was elected to the NSW Upper House in March 2007 where his portfolios have included education, energy, consumer affairs, water and gambling. John held a PhD from the University of California, Berkeley and was also a researcher and lecturer in electrical engineering at the University of New South Wales where he specialised in sustainable energy and greenhouse issues prior to being elected as Greens MLC in 2007.

John helped set the standard for what we should expect in all our politicians. He showed us how important it is in a thriving democracy to have principled and committed politicians such as John. He set the bar very high and his relentless work ethic were inspirational while always being tempered with great humanity and compassion.

John was a passionate and principled campaigner for public education and TAFE. He tenaciously and doggedly campaigned against the public funding of private independent schools and for the proper funding of our public schools in NSW.

The TAFE community alliance posted on their Facebook page:

"John Kaye was a prodigious intellect, a tireless battler for public education and TAFE....He used the facts to attack opponents. He did his research and spoke with passion and commitment. He will be deeply missed by us all. "

John never stopped campaigning and he never conceded ground. In fact when Premier Mike Baird heard that John was hospitalised he rang him to ask if he could assist in any way. John's reply was "Yeah mate you can stop gutting TAFE".

John worked day and night towards his vision for a fairer, more equal, sustainable and more humane society.

Over and over again he exposed the graft and the lies where he found them. He was a formidable critic, for example, of the unhealthy influence the gambling industry had on government in NSW. John showed enormous courage and principle in standing up to the vested interests which had facilitated the approval of the Packer Casino. John also drove a strong campaign to ban political donations from the alcohol, tobacco and gambling industries and to impose a cap on donations to individual parties and candidates. His work has helped make the NSW campaign funding system much more robust.

John was a strong unionist and a powerful community campaigner. He stood beside the local Leichhardt community on many, many occasions – whether battling to save

Callan Park from developers, stopping local overdevelopments or fighting to get proper funding for our local schools.

Dr John Kaye was also a formidable advocate for the need to urgently tackle global warming and build a pathway for a renewable energy future for NSW. Inspirational is the word that comes first to mind when describing John's work towards planning NSW's transition to renewable technologies and energy efficiency measures which would enable the closure of all fossil fuel power stations by 2030.

John once told me that he woke every day at 4.30am in order to properly prepare for the day ahead and capture the early media cycle. I have only one word to respond to that – Respect.

Perhaps John's greatest contribution to NSW is his uncompromising expectation of excellence and integrity in the political debate from all of his colleagues. He shone the light on the failings of our political system but he also fiercely defended it.

John was a brilliant community campaigner and believed in the power of the community to stand up to corporate vested interests. He was always there for everyone and used every day to give generously of his time and intellect to all of us.

ITEM 1.1 BAYS PRECINCT AFFORDABLE HOUSING STUDY AND JOINT CAMPAIGN

Background

Leichhardt Council has called for 30% of the Bays Precinct to be affordable housing, a figure that is also reflective of NSW Federation of Housing Associations nominated target.

Council's Housing Action Plan notes that there is an undersupply of affordable rental accommodation and that lower income groups are experiencing high levels of rental stress. Many people who need access to affordable housing work in the emergency services, health care and education sectors.

I also note that Strategy 7 Actions 5 and 6 of Council's Draft Housing Action Plan state:

"Council will advocate that the NSW Government and statutory bodies deliver affordable rental housing and diverse living models in accordance with evidence based benchmarks in the Bays Precinct and other urban renewal projects"

and that:

"Council should work with relevant NSW State Government and statutory bodies on redevelopment opportunities to include affordable housing in identified sites/precincts"

As part of Council's advocacy in relation to this issue I propose that we engage in a joint campaign with community housing providers and unions to promote affordable housing in the Bays Precinct.

We know that the NSW Government is currently progressing planning for the White Bay Power Station precinct which will have a residential component. To progress the actions identified in the Housing Action Plan and to further inform Council's policy position I propose that we utilise currently available funds in the 2015/16 budget to engage consultants to undertake a study:

- which identifies opportunities and constraints to meet the Bays Precinct affordable housing target
- identifies options to achieve a residential and mixed use urban environment with integrated open space and which meets a target of 30% affordable housing across the whole of the Bays Precinct
- identifies planning and governance mechanisms which could be used to deliver a 30% affordable housing component

That Council:

- 1. Develop a brief to engage suitably qualified consultants to prepare a study of the Bays Precinct which:
 - a) identifies options to achieve a residential and mixed use urban environment with integrated open space which meets a target of 30% affordable and 30% public housing across the whole of the Bays Precinct
 - b) identifies planning and governance mechanisms which could be used to deliver a 30% affordable and 30% public housing component.
- 2. Write to community housing providers, the NSW Federation of Housing Associations, the Sydney Alliance and Unions NSW and invite them to join with Leichhardt Council in a campaign of advocacy to the NSW State Government regarding the need for a target of 30% affordable and 30% public housing in the Bays Precinct.
- 3. Report back to the June Ordinary Council meeting on the draft brief and likely study costs.
- 4. Ensure that the proposal developed by the consultant be in line with Council's adopted Bays Precinct Guiding Principles.

ITEM 1.2 OPPOSITION TO WESTCONNEX

Background

Council has on several occasions confirmed its opposition to WestConnex, not only in our own area but in all the Local Government Areas in which it is proposed.

The individual components of WestConnex Motorway include:

- **Stage 1 M4 Widening** Parramatta to Homebush: approved, currently being constructed;
- **Stage 1b -M4 East** the extension of the M4 between Homebush and Haberfield in the form of the twin tunnels: approved and construction has commenced in Ashfield LGA;
- **Stage 2 New M5** twin tunnels from King Georges Road Beverly Hills to St Peter's/"Sydney Gateway" :recently approved in Marrickville LGA;
- King Georges Road intersection upgrade currently being constructed;
- Stage 3 M4 M5 link Haberfield to St Peters which is in the early stage of design with survey and geo technical work underway

Advice to date has been that Council has limited chances of legally challenging any of the current proposals, including those within our own LGA.

There are however indications that there may be possible avenues of challenge. It has been suggested that parts of the existing approvals may be open to challenge due to RMS's failure to adequately address how WestConnex would impact on current road use.

Condition B.43 of the Stage 2 Approval states that the project should:

not adversely impact on:

a) the performance of the road network for all road users, including but not limited to vehicles, freight, public transport and active transport and

b) existing access arrangements and services for all road users, including consideration of speed and reliability of public transport services

While it is clear that WestConnex will breach that requirement, anyone challenging that approval would need to gather evidence from traffic engineers that the impact on local traffic will be significant, and will be in breach of the condition.

The work currently being done through Rozelle has not reached the stage of an operational approval, but Council should commence preparation now for the stage currently being planned.

Leichhardt should also collaborate with neighbouring councils to ensure that we are working in concert to have a consistent strategy opposing WestConnex.

ITEM 1.3 COUNCIL DONATION TO BALMAIN PCYC

Background

PCYC was established in 1937 by Police Commissioner William John Mackay. It was a partnership forged with the community via Rotary to provide young people with a safe and positive alternative to the streets.

Over 75 years later that vision has grown and Police Citizens Youth Clubs NSW is one of Australia's leading youth focused organisations.

They provide an extensive and varied range of fun, safe activities for young people and the wider community focused on the reduction of crime by and against young people and on the promotion of citizenship within communities across the state.

The Balmain branch of the club has played a vital role in supporting the young people of Balmain and its surrounds since 1938.

As in 2014, I was again invited to take part in their annual fund raising event, which was held on 29 April at Loyalty Square in Balmain.

The event helps to raise funds for Police youth crime prevention programs and urgently needed sports and activity equipment at PCYC Balmain.

A number of higher profile locals have been invited to "do time to keep kids out of crime"

Participants will 'do time' in a simulated PCYC jail cell in a high traffic place, where they would rely on their friends, family and professional contacts to raise 'bail' in order for them to be released. Donations of \$2 and above are tax deductible.

In total, I raised \$242.75 in donations during my allotted time in the cell on 29 April.

As this is a worthy local cause, I would like to propose that council match all funds raised during my 'time' on a dollar for dollar basis.

ITEM 1.4 LOCAL SCHOOLS MAINTENANCE BACKLOG

Background

Recently released NSW Education Department documents reveal there are backlogs of up to \$800,000 for maintenance at each of the nine public primary schools and the two high schools within the Leichhardt Municipality. This is part of a massive \$732 million maintenance backlog across NSW. The documents detailing the NSW maintenance backlog, obtained under Freedom of Information by the State Labor opposition, reveal the individual maintenance backlogs for 2,173 government schools across the State as at 30 June 2015.

Annandale, Leichhardt, Rozelle and Birchgrove primary schools all have a backlog of more than \$0.5 million each, as do both Leichhardt and Balmain Sydney Secondary College campuses. Details are as follows;

Without urgent Government attention and the much needed funds to deal with this backlog, the problem is only going to worsen in our local public schools in the years to come. Public schools in our area are also under added pressure given the demographic changes we are witnessing from the massive baby boom in recent years that is now reaching school age. Enrolments at all local schools have increased in recent years, in some cases by more than 100%. Capacity assessments indicate that there is very little or no capacity for additional teaching spaces in our local schools.

Council has previously resolved to write to the NSW Minister for Education on the issues of lack of teaching spaces and growing enrolments, and the lack of out of school hours care. This advocacy on Out of School Hours has led to some NSW Government action to address the critical undersupply of Out of School Hours Care places, including the creation of a grants program to support additional Out of School Hours Care places.

- health and aged care workers
- public school teachers
- social assistance workers
- public transport workers

b. use the findings of the review to inform the new Central District Plan;

c. review the range of 'key worker' (or 'essential worker') definitions and their applicability to the essential workers listed in 3a);

d. explore and implement ways to ensure that any governance arrangements introduced into the Central District Plan in relation to 'affordable housing' give preference to 'essential workers' so that those workers can access affordable housing close to where they work, for instance at Royal Prince Alfred Hospital.
