Background:

Published research into the projections and outcomes of the M5 shows that more roads do not help alleviate the traffic problems. Roads induce traffic. Last week Mr. Martin Ferguson, former shadow transport minister, announced his intention to help Sydney's traffic by funding more roads, including the extension of the M4.

Recommendation:

That Leichhardt Council write to the Prime Minister, Mr. Kevin Rudd and to Mr. Martin Ferguson requesting that the new Labor government cancel their intention to fund the M4E and that they instead contribute that funding to an integrated rail/light rail/bus public transport infrastructure in NSW, and that they contribute funding to a feasibility study for a metro rail line travelling under Victoria Road from the Rozelle goods yards to Parramatta.

Background:

The master plan being prepared for Callan Park just gets worse. There can be no doubt it would destroy Callan Park as an oasis of tranquil, healing beauty and the public open space would be lost forever.

In just a fortnight – since the public information sessions of October 28 - the extra floor space the University of Sydney option requires has increased from 30,000 square metres to 40,000 square metres (that's about 8 football fields). That's a 47% increase on the existing floor space.

This was revealed at the misnamed "community reference panel" meeting on Wednesday night.

This will require a major amendment to the Callan Park Act which at present forbids any extra floor space on Callan Park. If this limitation is lifted, then the door is open for substantial over development. The University has already told us this extra development is "a minimum". So what more is there to come? Already four storey buildings are being talked about.

One community member of the reference panel described these proposals as "the butchering of Callan Park".

Hints of massive car parking on site were given at the Wednesday night meeting – it would include a huge parking station (they say it will be underground) as well as more parking along Balmain Road and Glover Street. At least 1200 car spaces are envisaged.

Sydney Harbour Foreshore Authority and the Sartor consultants are sticking to their timetable – the master plan will go on exhibition at the end of November and be on exhibition for the summer months.

Local MP Verity Firth could stop these proposals in their tracks if she wanted to, but there is no sign of that, so a massive public reaction will be needed.

Recommendation:

That Council, in keeping with its former unanimous resolutions to oppose the Sydney University takeover of Callan Park, set aside \$10,000 to fund the campaign against the take over by Sydney University and any proposed changes to the Callan Park legislation.

That Council reiterate its opposition to any change to the Callan Park special provisions Act to the Premier, and write to every upper house and lower house mp stating its opposition to the changing of the act.

That Council write again to the Sydney Harbour Foreshore Authority and the Minister stating its opposition to the proposal so far and stating its opposition to any change to the Callan Park act.

That Council write to the local MP Verity Firth stating its continued opposition to the Sydney University proposal, its continued support for the hospital and to mental health services on site, and its opposition to any change to the Callan Park legislation.

That Council write to the Prime Minister Kevin Rudd, stating its opposition to the Sydney University proposal and opposition to privatisation by stealth of public education, and its opposition to any change to the state Callan Park special provisions bill.

That Council also request that in the interests of the mentally ill and their families and the community, the new and compassionate Prime Minister, Mr. Kevin Rudd, fund the continuation of the Rozelle hospital as a state of the art psychiatric hospital on the site at Callan Park.

That Council advertise its statement of opposition to the Prime Minister, and its request of Mr. Rudd in its council column.
